Volunteer Role Description

Minibus/Shuttle service driver

What would you have to do?

- Help visitors discover the whole of Stackpole by driving a minibus around the site between key visitor locations and picking up and dropping off as required.

What's in it for you?

- Becoming part of a friendly and dedicated team
- Meeting people from all walks of life and making new friends
- Enjoying new experiences and learning something new every day

What's involved?

- Check in with the team at the start of each shift to keep up to date with what is happening across Stackpole
- Providing a friendly and informed welcome to all visitors
- To be within the age restrictions applying to drivers of NT vehicles.
- To have held a full, clean driving license for a minimum of two years.
- To hold a MiDAS Certificate by attending the Driver Assessment and Training (to be organised by NT).
- Complete log of passengers carried on a daily basis.
- To check fuel, lights, tyres, bodywork etc are in good working order before setting off. Reporting faults on form provided.
- To communicate effectively with the Estate Office using on-board radio.
- To be aware of speed constraints within the area.
- To drive in a careful manner ensuring vehicle and property are not damaged and safeguarding walkers, cyclists and other road users.
- An awareness of any arrangements for the special needs of disabled or less mobile persons, affording help where necessary.

This role is purely voluntary and does not create a legally binding arrangement or employment contract

- Compliance with the Trust's Health and Safety Policy at all times. Taking appropriate action and reporting back on potential hazards and accidents.
- To be put into practice the behaviours relevant to the vehicle as a touch point and to provide the highest possible visitor experience.
- Attending training sessions, including pre-season briefings.
- Working as part of a large team of staff and volunteers to ensure visitors have a great day out at Stackpole.
