Son of Vivienne, Lady Cawley, the donor of Berrington Hall.

Mrs Susan Clive

Daughter of the donor of Nunnington Hall.

Spencer Copeland

Son of the donor of Trelassick.

Michael Hoare

Member of the Finance Committee since 1999.

Jack Kingan

Donor of land around Ballymacormick Point, he was also the Northern Ireland Committee's Honorary Treasurer in the 1950s.

Miss Alice Lascelles

Last remaining member of the donor family who gave Woolbeding House and Estate in 1958.

Stanley Long

Donor of Lower Halsdon Farm, comprising 45ha (111 acres) of pasture adjoining 1/4 mile of shoreline along the Exe estuary.

Anthony Lord OBE

Land Agent and then Director in the North West Region, and then Director in Northern Ireland from 1979 until 1991.

Gerald McGuire

Member of the Yorkshire Regional Committee from 1985 to 1993.

John Morley

Member of the Council from 1985 until 1988, nominated by the Victoria & Albert Museum of which he was Keeper of Furniture.

Chairman of the Committee for Northumberland and Co. Durham (later the Committee for Northumbria) and member of the Executive Committee from 1964 until 1979.

Sir Ralph Verney, Bt KBE

In addition, many donors agreed that their gift could be used wherever the need was greatest. This allowed the Trust to allocate over £658,000 to a wide range of projects in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

In response to the foot and mouth disease last year, we put our planned fundraising programme on hold in order to send out an emergency appeal. Many members and supporters gave generously to the appeal which raised a fantastic £1,008,317 for the Living Countryside Fund. This fund was set up in order to give our tenant farmers practical help in the aftermath of the crisis and also to develop a more sustainable future for farming. In addition, the Lake District Crisis Fund, created specifically to deal with problems in this region, raised £156,051.

As 2001 was National Trust Gardens Year, an appeal was launched to raise funds for our work in this area. As a result, £239,112 will be allocated to researching, restoring and maintaining the gardens in our care.
