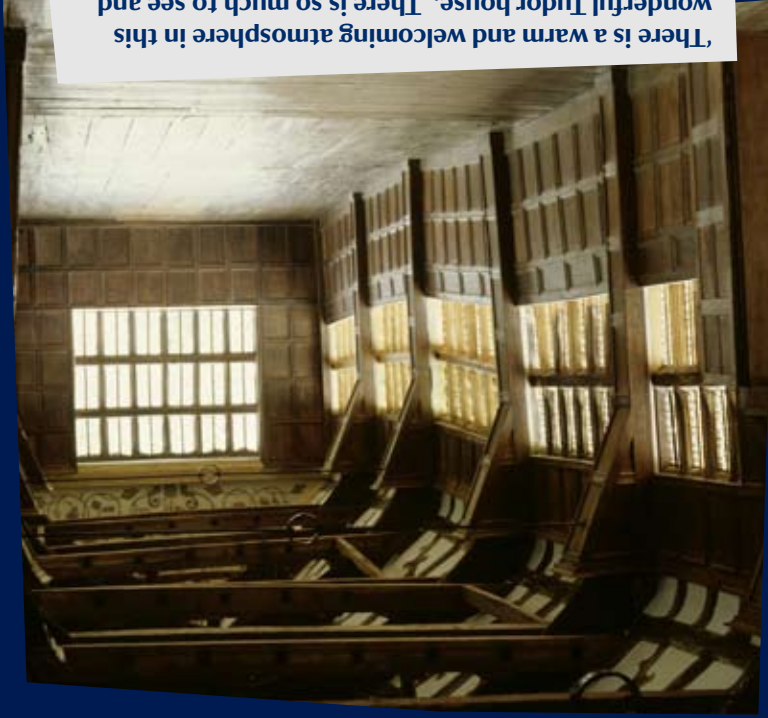


Explore Little Moreton Hall with us using the map over the page.

**Welcome to Little Moreton Hall**



- 1** **Hall entrance**  
 Free guided tours run at certain times of the day. See the meeting board in the courtyard.  
 Please help us by not wearing sharp-heeled shoes.  
 There are uneven floors in the Hall, spiral staircases and an open fire in the Great Hall.  
 For loan: baby carriers and hip seats (available from the Welcome Host on the bridge).
- 2** **Access to upstairs**
- 3** **Broomhouse Restaurant and Great Hall entrance**  
 Open from 11am serving morning coffee, lunch and afternoon tea. Children's menu, high chairs, large-handled cutlery and a large print menu are available.
- 4** **Shop**  
 Open from 11.30am. Our shop sells a good range of high quality gifts including our popular souvenir guidebook (also available from the ticket office in the car park).

- 5** **WCs**
- 6** **Ice cream kiosk (seasonal)**
- 7** **Orchard** - flat pathway around edge of Orchard.  
 Surface: loose compacted gravel
- 8** **Knot Garden**  
 Garden guide leaflet available from the ticket office in the car park.
- 9** **Accessible WC and baby changing facility**
- Start of estate walk**  
 Walk leaflet with details of gradients, distance and path surface available from the ticket office in the car park and the Welcome Host on the bridge
- Picnic areas** - tables available in the car park



### Make the most of your visit ...

- Take a free guided tour to discover the fascinating history of the Hall and the Moreton family
- Explore the crooked Long Gallery and upper floors at your own pace
- Relax in the Orchard and see the Knot Garden
- Discover the rare sixteenth century wall paintings and wall paper – and the Victorian dog kennel
- Enjoy delicious home cooked food in the restaurant and visit the well stocked shop for gifts and souvenirs

- The moated area is open water and care must be taken, particularly with young children. The courtyard is cobbled and the floors in the Hall are uneven so please mind your step**
- Portable induction loops in the shop, ticket office and on guided tours**
- Virtual tour of the Hall available on the ground floor which is accessible for wheelchair users**
- Manual wheelchairs available for loan. Please ask a member of staff for details**
- Braille, large print and foreign language guides available from the ticket office**
- Assistance dogs welcome in all areas**

**End of Feb - mid March open Sat/ Sun until 4pm**  
**Mid March - Oct open Wed - Sun until 5pm**  
**Nov - Dec open Sat/ Sun until 4pm**  
**Last admission is 30 mins before closing.**
