The servant's hall, now home to a fascinating handling collection and children's costumes to try on.

The Georgian stables, once home to the Peckover's horses - some of their names are still visible above the stalls.

The Orangery, home to our orange trees which are 300 years old and still fruiting!

Step inside the home of the Peckovers, a family of Quaker bankers who lived here for 150 years. Delve into their lives and enjoy the sensory delights of this wonderful two-acre garden.

A cabinet of curiosities

Peckover is a Georgian house full of surprises: it is elegant and refined, yet intimate and relaxed.

The Peckovers, who lived here from the 1790s were a family of wealthy bank managers and Quakers. They were passionate, generous, artistic and curious about the world. Discover some of their world during your visit.

- Get up close to a Greek manuscript nearly 1000 years old

Outside, a gardener's paradise awaits you. The two-acre Victorian garden has hidden corners and paths, and the occasional touch of the exotic. - Come and see our beehives and take some Peckover honey home with you from our gift shop



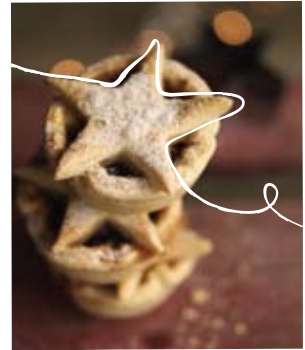
Enjoy a game of croquet on the lawn or bring the whole family for a picnic

We are open all week 4 - 7 July for Wisbech Rose Fair, the largest flower festival in East Anglia.

Peckover Flower Festival - our popular biennial flower festival returns in 2012 with floral arrangements celebrating the diversity of the National Trust. 15 - 19 September, 11am - 5pm.

Come back at Christmas to see our fabulous festive floral arrangements and Christmas trees in the house. Open from 12 - 6pm on 8, 9, 15 and 16 December. Adult £3, child £1.



Year-round highlights:

Visit the tearoom in our 17th Century thatched Reed Barn and our well stocked gift shop near visitor reception.

On certain Wednesdays and Saturdays there is a chance to meet costumed guides. 'Lord Peckover' will take you around his garden, and meet 'Alexandrina Peckover' who regularly welcomes visitors to her family home.
