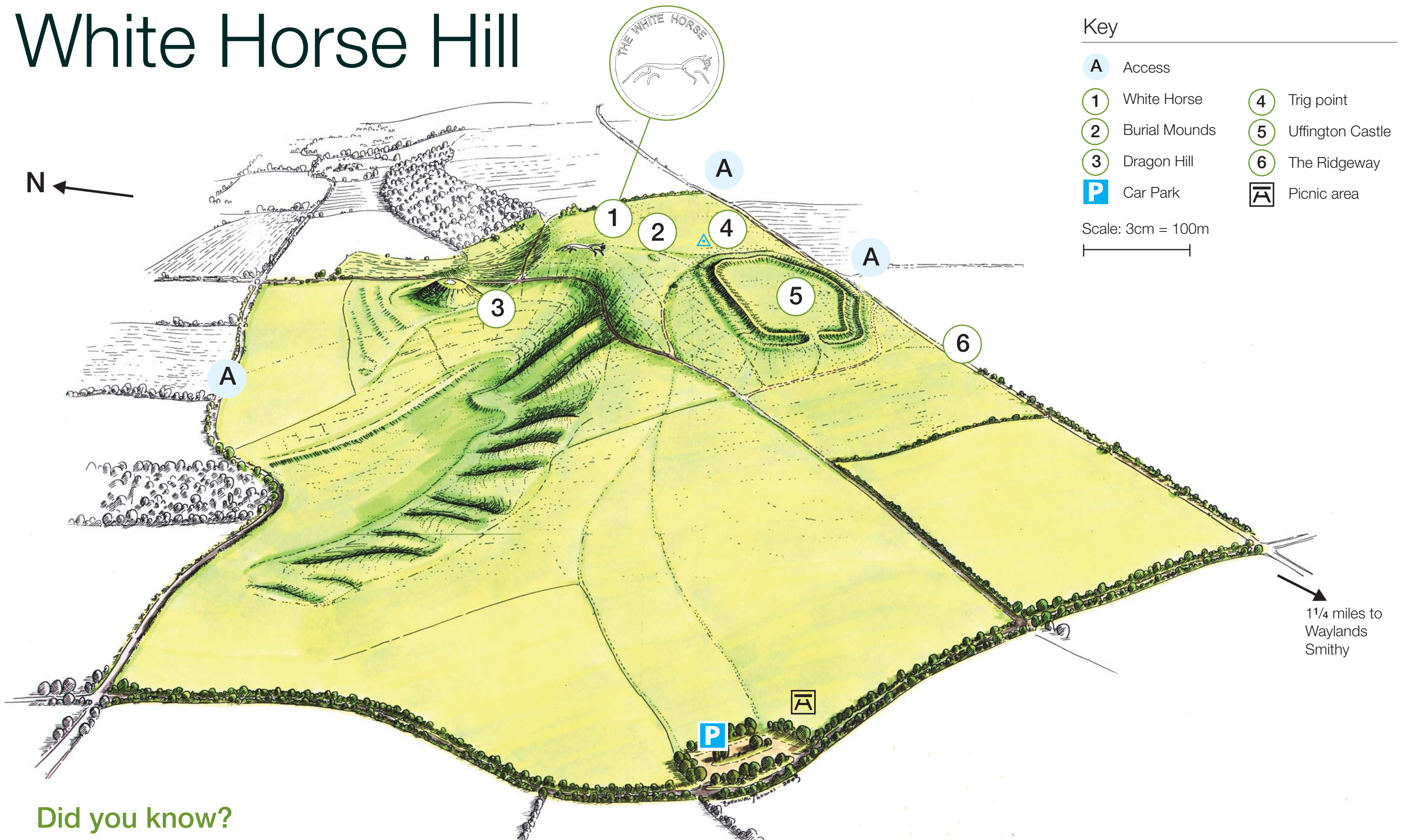


# White Horse Hill



## Did you know?

1. The White Horse is the oldest dated chalk figure in the country.
2. The various burial mounds date from Neolithic to Romano-British times and formed a sacred landscape for settlements in the area.
3. Dragon Hill is a natural chalk outcrop shaped by man. It is steeped in legend and an historic site of pagan rituals.
4. This is the highest point in Oxfordshire at 262 metres, and is the best place to view the dramatic landform of high crest and rippling valley below.
5. Uffington Castle is an early Iron Age hill fort, one of a series along the Ridgeway.
6. The Ridgeway is an ancient route running for 85 miles across the Downs; in prehistoric times, its high, dry ground made for easier travel than through the thickly wooded valleys below.
