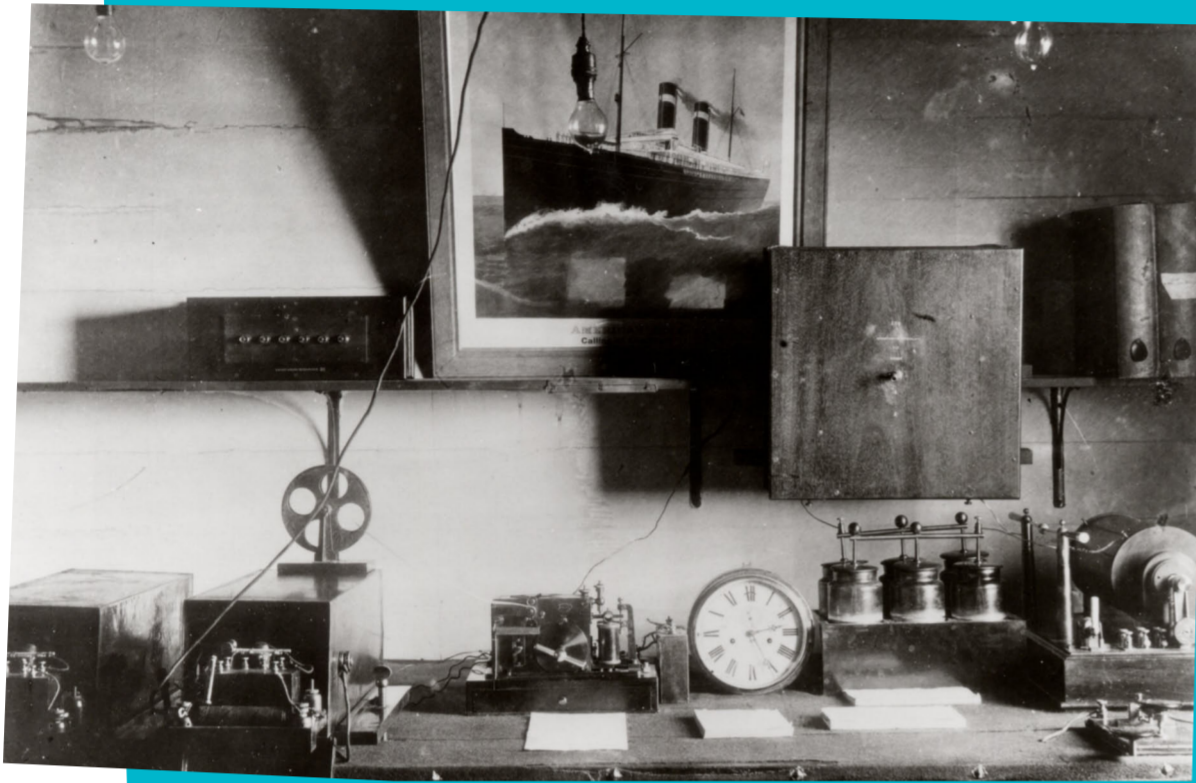

Marconi's Lizard Wireless Station

Open from 4th April until 31st October 2017: Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays from 12 noon - 3pm (weather permitting)

Entry: suggested donation of £1 per person | National Trust members free.

Step back in time to 1901, inside one of the oldest surviving wireless stations in the world.

How to get there

Opened as a museum by enthusiastic volunteers, this small wooden hut is perched on the cliff top above Housel Bay, just 1 mile east along the coast path from Lizard Point car park (N.B. this route along the coast path includes some uneven ground and steep climbs). For an alternative, flatter route, park in Lizard Village and follow signs to Housel Bay. As you approach the hotel, take the path on the left just before the hotel, and follow the coast path east (left) for 200m. Unfortunately there is no parking available at the Wireless Station.
