Hail Caesar



10 miles/6 hours

Discover a hidden Roman road as you follow ancient tracks to the Roman forts at Castleshaw.

10 miles/5.5 hours

A strenuous walk to explore the four aircraft wrecks on the moors. Of interest to serious walkers and aviation or recent history enthusiasts. Meet at Digley Reservoir car park (south, grid ref 109068)

Good Friday family walk

6.5 miles/5.5 hours



A slow paced walk along some lesser known moorland paths with lots of photo opportunities. Ideal for families wanting to explore the moors.

A mostly easy walk around the Colne Valley but with some steep climbs up rough cobbled tracks.

5 miles/2.5 hours

There are some steep slopes on this moderate circular walk but you'll be rewarded with stunning views.

To the Heights

11.5 miles/6.5 hours


See extensive Pennine views as we cross the watershed to the 18th-century Heights Church at Delph and return along Harrop Edge and Pule slades.  

May

Tuesday 1 May, 6.30pm

Meet the lambs



2.5 miles/2 hours

Bring all the family to meet the lambs you see on the moors and find out how the orphan lambs are looked after. No dogs. 

Saturday 5 May, 10am

Greenfield to Marsden



10 miles/5.5 hours

Meet at Greenfield station and follow ancient routes across the Pennine ridge and down to Marsden. Train: Huddersfield to Manchester or Bus: 184.  

Saturday 12 May, 10am

A walk on the Pennine Way



7.5 miles/4 hours

Explore the historic landscape along the moor's edge with fantastic views from the Pennine Way. Starts at Brun Clough car park, 3 miles SW of Marsden on the A62.

Laddow rocks circular

21 miles/9 hours

A strenuous circular walk across the moor tops and valleys from Standedge to Chew Valley, returning by Black Hill.

6.5 miles/5 hours



A gentle paced walk for all the family visiting five historic reservoirs with lots of rest stops and photo opportunities.

Take a boat trip all the way through Britain's longest, highest and deepest canal tunnel and a fairly strenuous 5 mile guided walk over the moors. Saturday 16 June, 3am

Early morning madness


7 miles/5 hours incl. breakfast

Walk on the moor, catch the sunrise and end the walk with a well-earned breakfast. £7, booking essential on 01484 847016.

Thursday 21 June, 8pm

Summer solstice


4 miles/2 hours

Stroll on the Pennine Way along Millstone Edge to see stunning far reaching views and watch the sun set on the longest day. Meet at Brun Clough car park, 3 miles SW of Marsden on the A62.

Secrets of Wessenden

4 miles/3 hours


Amid the beautiful Wessenden valley hear the secrets of the Luddites, a textile dynasty, early farmsteads and the effects of the reservoir construction.

Marsden Moor three peaks


11 miles/6 hours

Take in the high points of Marsden Moor and be rewarded with spectacular views. Suitable for any relatively fit walker but does include some steep climbs.

This time of year the hill farmers of Marsden are shearing their sheep. Bring the family to walk to one of the oldest local farms to see how this is done. No dogs.

Jazz walk



2 miles/1.5 hours

Climb to Buckstones Moss to see extensive long range views and then follow the ridge boundary stones to the head of Scammonden valley.  




November
